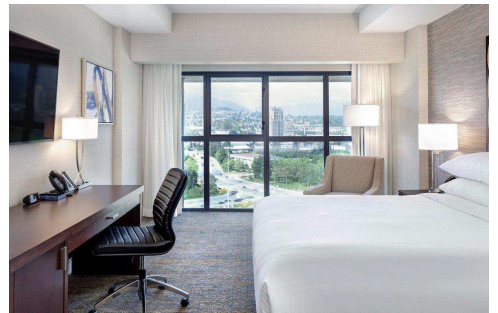
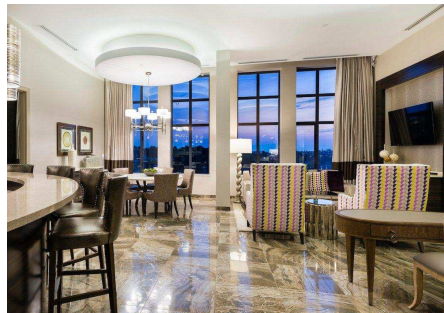
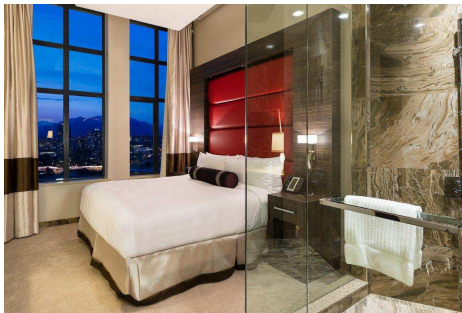

As we close out our second full season in a global pandemic, the one word that comes to mind is resilience (the capacity to recover quickly). Nothing about this time has been easy on so many levels but as we plan for our first in person AGM since 2019, I am able to look back and am proud of the work done by our Section, our Regions, our Clubs, and most important our athletes. As the waves hit us and one minute, we were planning events, the next minute we were cancelling them, as challenging as it was, we persevered. Our membership numbers this year are outstanding.

Our 2021-2022 membership was higher than our 2019-2020 membership! I have spoke to many club presidents, and coaches who are so cautiously optimistic that this membership growth will continue, and we will see skaters stay with the sport for life. No matter the pathway an athlete takes, our goal remains to help all Canadians (and new Canadians) embrace the joy for skating.

Competition Delivery proved once again to be on a pendulum. However, we now know our capabilities to host events successfully virtually, in-person, or a combination of both. It was so important that we were able to provide competitive opportunities for all skaters within the province. Though we did have to cancel events in January and February, we did rebound and hosted three successful events in March for StarSkate, Synchronized skating, Adult skaters, and Special Olympic skaters and just last month we travelled once again to Parksville on Vancouver Island for a complete in-person Super Series VISI. Assessment Days are back in full swing. We are slowly starting to see more in-person

Assessment Days taking place but the ability to do Virtual Assessment Days has been so important for the continuity of development. We are seeing skaters take tests many times throughout the season instead of just once and at a much-reduced cost to the athlete. Though I believe that there is still room for improvement on this method of assessments I am confident in the plan that our section has to ensure that we provide a positive experience for the athlete, coach, official and club. A huge thank you to Haley Adams and Danielle Williams who have attended every virtual assessment day this year acting as our Service Technicians. Also, thank you to those officials who have completed the Star 6 – Gold training and continue to support our skaters through these assessments.

A major event this year was the hosting of Skate Canada International at UBC Thunderbird Arena. This was a difficult event and our team of volunteers stepped up and delivered. Though the event was in a “bubble” it still required a small but mighty team to do everything from driving, catering, logistics, and security to name a few. It was a very busy week, but at the end we were treated to a tremendous display of talent in the lead up to the 2022 Beijing Olympic Winter Games. It was such a rush to see our very own Kelly Cruikshank and Janice Hunter officiate in Beijing. Hearing their stories, I am sure it was an experience they will never forget, and we are fortunate to have them as part of our skating family.

As we look back on another memorable season, I remain inspired by the work of our board, our regions, our clubs, coaches, officials and most importantly athletes. They are resilient and are ready for whatever next season has in store!

• **Announcements**

Due to the ever-changing situation, once again, all competition announcements were handled by the Section and posted accordingly. Thank you to Danielle Williams for overseeing this.

• **Competitive/Podium Pathway**

In keeping with Skate Canada's new Long Term Development (LTD) Resource, we will now refer to 'Podium Pathway' rather than 'Competitive' for those skaters who compete in Juvenile to Senior Categories. The Quick Reference Guides for Singles, Pairs and Dance have been updated to align with LTD and are posted on the Technical Page of the website. In addition to the usual Short Program group changes, there are changes to the Pre-Juvenile and Juvenile Well Balanced Program Requirements and a change to the solo spin in the Pre-Novice and Novice Women's Short Program. It should be noted that as the Section competitions transition to align with LTD and the Athlete Development Matrices (ADM), the Pre-Juvenile category may be eliminated moving forward.

• **STARSkate**

This past season there were no significant changes to the STAR competition requirements and at the time of writing, the same is true for the 2022-2023 season. Any changes that may be made will be in keeping with the ADM for the STAR Pathway. These will be communicated and posted on the Skating In BC website as soon as they are published by Skate Canada.

Thank you to all Section Technical Officials for another season spent training and officiating in the Virtual Competitions world. Again, everyone rose to the occasion with great attitudes and a willingness to give our skaters performance opportunities.

2. Develop the annual operational plans and budgets for judge/evaluator initiatives
3. Recruit, train and develop judges and evaluators in order that they can competently assess skaters.
4. Communicate with and provide educational opportunities and support for the BC/YK Judge/Evaluator community
5. Assist in the development of Judge/Evaluator related input for the Section’s annual strategic planning process
6. Have input to Skate Canada policy changes and amendments that are submitted by the BC/YK Section

With the huge impact COVID has had on our sport again this season, the Judges Committee’s focus has mainly been on remote officiating/evaluating. Many competitions had to be either remote officiating or cancelled all together. Our first in-person officiating competition was the 2022 BC/YK Section Championships in November. Fingers crossed that in-person competition officiating will continue going forward.

Assessment days are beginning to shift from remote to in-person when requested.

Program Updates

Mentorship Program - Throughout the pandemic, for those currently in the Mentorship Program, we did post in our Teams platform when the larger ISU competition were being held with a schedule and invitation to watch as a group and/or to post questions/comments that came up. We do think as we head towards VDI, it would be time to renew interest from and reach out to our Mentorship group again.

Synchronized Skating - the BC/YK section partnered with Alberta section and hosted an annual Synchro Judge/Coach update. The first BC/YK Synchro competition since the pandemic was held in March in South Surrey and thirteen teams competed. Skate Canada hosted an officials program at the National Synchro Championships in February in Calgary. Shannon Downing attended from our Section.

Training

Competitive Pairs Judge Seminar - A remote Competitive Pairs Seminar was held during last summer. It was facilitated by Laura Carr and there were nine participants. Promotion recommendations will be reviewed by members of this committee in the coming weeks. Successful participants will then be assigned a mentor.

STAR 1 to 4 Competitive Training - As Skate Canada has still not completed the refresh of the STAR 1-4 Judge Resource Guide, no STAR training was held this past season. Regions are currently reviewing their budgets to determine if they will be moving forward with STAR training once the refreshed material is released.

"We have no idea what the coming year will bring but with the innovation shown in our Section one thing is sure - the innovation will continue and because of that our entries will continue to grow to pre-covid numbers."

Looking at registrations for competitions this year skating is alive and well in the BC/YK Section.

This is a snapshot of the 2021-2022 Competition year.

Victoria Day: May 20-23, 2021 - Virtual Competition

SummerSkate: August 9-15, 2021 - 7 days - 586 competitors - live skating, virtual judging - no audience

Autumn Leaves: October 14-17, 2021 - 5 days - 454 competitors - live skating, virtual judging - no audience

Sectionals: November 11-14, 2021 - 4 days - 247 competitors - the first live skating and live judging event!

With a sigh of relief, it seemed that everything was getting back to normal. Regions held Interclubs - some with live skating and live judging and some with live skating and virtual judging.

And then another wave hit! Arenas were shut down as well as many other Public Health Orders put in place.

January 21-23, 2022 East Kootenay Invitational - CANCELLED

January 28-30, 2022 CNC Regionals - CANCELLED

February 4-6, 2022 Winterskate - CANCELLED

February 11-13, 2022 VI Regionals - CANCELLED

February 11-13, 2022 Totem - CANCELLED

And then we came back stronger!

March 4-6, 2022 STARSkate Live - 3 days - 467 competitors

March 11-13, 2022 STARSkate Virtual - 3 days - 589 competitors

April 1-3, 2022 Super Series Vancouver Island - 3 days - 564 competitors

May 20-22, 2022 Super Series Victoria Days - **over 1100 competitors registered!!**

There are many amazing things about the BC/YK Section but the one thing that shone through this year was the unbelievable dedication of our volunteers. In a year where you never knew from one day to the next if we were suddenly having a competition and it was all hands-on deck, or sorry another event has been cancelled. The event coordinators, music players, announcers, ice captains, dressing room attendants, registration and even COVID police. The judges, tech panels, DS and all those who worked from home so we could have virtual judging and the competitors from around the province could still compete.

To say it was success would be an understatement. Ted Barton and Steve Muff leading the Production, Laura Carr and Danielle Williams training officials and Sharon Dahl training the Data Specialists.

Despite the continued challenges the pandemic threw our direction, many of our skaters continued to excel and achieve new personal bests this season -- especially Wesley Chiu. Wesley started with a bang winning the Junior Grand Prix event in Courchevel, France, and never looked back. After landing on the podium at the Junior Grand Prix in Russia, Wesley continued to turn heads with an outstanding 4th place freeski in his first senior event at the Challenger event in Warsaw. Sadly, the pandemic cancelled the Junior Grand Prix Final but that didn't stop him from claiming the bronze at the Canadian Senior Championships and finishing the season with a tremendous 4th place finish in Tallin, Estonia at the Junior Worlds Championships. Congratulations to Wesley and coaches Keegan and Eileen Murphy on an outstanding season and we wish all continued success in the seasons to come.

BC/YK skaters received a total of 17 international assignments. Congratulations to Beres Clements on earning a Bronze in Senior Men at Autumn Classic, a silver by Junior Ice dancers, Miku Makita and Tyler Gunera at the first Junior Grand Prix in Courchevel, France and to David Li for a gold medal performance in the Advanced Novice Boys' category at the Egna Spring Trophy in Italy in April 2022. Congratulations to Haley Sales and Nikolas Wamsteeker, for earning an ISU Championship assignment, the Four Continents Championship, where they finished in 7th place.

Our Section qualified 28 entries at the National Championships in the disciplines of singles, pairs, dance and synchro. Congratulations to Wesley Chiu for his bronze medal in Senior Men, Miku Makita and Tyler Gunera for their bronze in Junior dance, Kara Yun, the silver medalist in the Novice Women's event, and Jessie Sun and Victor Lum, bronze medalists in Novice Pairs.

Forty-one entries from our Section competed at the Skate Canada Challenge event in Regina, Saskatchewan where we won 9 medals including 5 silver and 4 bronze. Congratulations to all our skaters and coaches for your achievements this past season often under challenging circumstances.

This season also marked the last time that we will have our national competition format in its current form. Moving forward we will now have the discipline of synchronized skating joining singles, pairs and dance with junior and senior Challenge occurring in early December and Nationals in January. Pre-Novice and Novice skaters will qualify for their nationals at their own Challenge event held in later January with nationals slated for late February.

This change reflects some of the objectives of the new athlete development model. Skate Canada is realigning its competition calendar and reviewing category criteria to reflect the targets and guidelines contained within this new model. These changes will also necessitate a review our how and when we structure our events in our Section.

Thank you to members of the Skater Development Committee who were consulted from time to time over the season as our Section pivoted to respond to changing circumstances: Aaron Lowe, Neil Wilson, Jason Mongrain, Keegan Murphy, Diane Kamagianis, Steve Muff, Jamie McGrigor, Sally Rehorick, Janice Hunter, Dawn Williams and Section staff, Ted Barton and Danielle Williams.

In total we have 36 clubs in our region.

The BC Coast Region serves its clubs, skaters, parents and volunteers in many ways. And we are excited to move forward.

I'd like specially to send gratitude and thanks to our outgoing our board member Siobhan Philips for her many years of service, somewhere like 10 years with the BC Coast Region Board. Siobhan was our mainstay of reliability in our high-test program. Siobhan is going to be missed on the BCCR board, and we wish her well in her future activities. I'd also like to recognize Lori Oxland, as she steps away from the Past Chair role. Her 16+ years of BC Coast Region board association is very noticeable and has been so meaningful and valuable for our sport in the Region.

I'd also like to send a message of gratitude to the BC/YK Section Board for standing strong through these Covid times, The Section's huge task of interpreting public health orders, running remote activities like tests and virtual competitions was not only innovative, but it has kept the sport going strong in BC. This task requires many thanks from everyone involved in Skating in BC.

Since this is the end of my four year term, I am not seeking any new nominations, and will assume the role of past-chair, I am looking forward to the 2022/23 season, we will have a new board with a new chair and many new opportunities as we hope to get back to more normal operations, the ability to collaborate with the hard-working and enthusiastic volunteers throughout out our Region and Section.

Last but certainly not least, the CNCR would like to recognize Carol Giesbrecht for her incredible dedication to the skaters, coaches, clubs, and Board. Since beginning on the Board in 2009, she has become a pillar in helping to keep the CNCR moving forward. When Carol took over as chairperson, I was also new to the Board and we laughed about how neither one of us really knew what to do.
