LATE ENTRIES WILL BE CHARGED DOUBLE THE ENTRY FEE. All payments must be made online at the time of registration.

<u>Online Registration</u> must be completed by 11:45 p.m. Wednesday, March 14th, 2012. Instructions for entering online can be found on page 6 of this announcement.

For STARSkate categories age and tests passed shall be as of March 14, 2012 (closing date of entries). Pre-Juvenile to Senior, the age shall be as of July 1, 2011

The new age categories as defined by Skate Canada do not come into effect until July 1, 2012.

PLANNED PROGRAM SHEETS for ALL Free Skate events may be submitted online with skater entry information or sent to the BC/YT Section office via fax (604 205 6962). Deadline to submit changes to planned program sheets is April 4, 2012. Skaters arriving to compete who have not submitted a planned

program sheet will be required to complete one when they register their music.

A tentative schedule of events and groups will be posted on the <u>competition page</u> of the BC/YT Section website. Any last minute changes to schedules will be posted on the website and also at the arena. **Please note that events may start up to one half hour earlier than scheduled.**

Starting orders will be posted a minimum of 24 hours prior to the start of the competition.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. Previous winners of a Pre-Preliminary event must move up. There are no restrictions for other categories that a skater may have won previously.
- 2. Skaters may enter only one event per discipline of singles, pairs, dance and interpretive.
- 3. Should entries in a category be exceedingly large, the event will be divided into smaller groups which will determined by random draw. Each group will be considered a final and the highest total score from all competitors in the event will determine the winner. Performance, Pre-Preliminary & Preliminary groups will be divided according to age. Interpretive events will be divided by free skate test level first and then if further grouping is required, by age.
- 4. If an event has only one competitor, the skater will be informed and have the option of skating up an event, skating for an evaluation only, or withdrawing with a refund. Competitors may skate up one category higher than they are qualified.
- MARKING: The CPC Scoring system will be used for all events except Pre-Preliminary and Preliminary Free Skate which will be judged using the <u>Pre-Preliminary/Preliminary Points</u> <u>System</u>. Performance category is assessed and skaters receive an evaluation and certificate.
- 6. REGISTRATION:

Skaters must register at least one hour before their event is scheduled to start.

7. WARM UP TIMES:

Preliminary to Senior Bronze 4 minutes
Junior Silver to Gold Free Skate 5 minutes
Pre-Juvenile 5 minutes
Juvenile to Senior Competitive 6 minutes

Dance events will be conducted in accordance with Skate Canada regulations.

* At the discretion of the Referee, the warm up periods may be reduced to a minimum of 3 minutes. All warm-up periods for one event must be equal.

8. MUSIC REQUIREMENTS:

- Only CD's will be accepted. Only one program shall be recorded on each CD.
- The start of the music shall be recorded on the CD with less than two seconds of lead in.

- Competitor's name followed by music time (not skating time) shall be clearly printed on one side of the CD.
- Each CD shall be enclosed in its plastic container, also marked with the skater's name, home club, event and total music time.
- Competitors must hand in their music at the registration desk at least one hour prior to the start of their event. The Organizing Committee will accept no responsibility against damage but will take every precaution to safeguard each CD.
- A backup CD is a requirement of each competitor and should be at rinkside during the skater's performance.
- 9. ICE SURFACE: 80' x 200'
- 10. COACHES: It is mandatory for all participating coaches to register at competitions and show their accreditation at all times during the competition in order to be at ice level during the events. Temporary accreditation will be issued for \$25.00 by showing current Skate Canada membership and First Aid information.
- 11. ADMISSION will be free to all.
- 12. AWARDS: A notice will be posted in the arena with information regarding the time and location of medal presentations.
- 13. Persons wishing to take photographs of on ice performances are reminded that use of flash cameras is forbidden. The use of video cameras must be restricted to areas that do not hamper the skaters or officials. **PLEASE NOTE:** you may only take pictures or videos of your own skater.
- 14. <u>Protest Policy:</u> Skate Canada Protest Policy for competitions using CPC will be followed. RULE 7301 (6) (4). In addition, if there is an event using manual calculation where the results are not posted within one hour of the completion of the last event of the day, the protest must be made to the Event Referee within the first hour of the following day's competition. If the Event Referee is unavailable, the protest may be made to the Technical Representative.

Skate Canada-BC/YT Section has an online registration system with the company Karelo.com. All registrations must be completed using this online system. <u>Click here</u> to register.

Using Karelo for the first time

The first time you use Karelo.com to register for an event, you will be asked to choose a <u>log in name & a password</u>, and to enter your contact information. When entering contact information, please use the skater's name and not the parent's name. Skate Canada Number must be entered as per your Skate Canada Card (i.e. 10 digits including all zeros). This is a very short and simple step that will enable you to avoid the hassle of re-entering your information for each event registration! Your contact information is never shared with third parties. Please review Karelo's 'Privacy Policy' for more details.

Entering your registration

<u>If you have never used Karelo.com before</u>, go to '<u>I am new to Karelo.com</u>' and select a login name and a password; enter your contact information. Then follow these steps:

- 1. Log in. Select the event that you want to register for from the **Event List**
- 2. Enter your registration information.
- 3. Enter your credit card information (Visa or MasterCard). This is a secure transaction. Your credit card is charged immediately.
- 4. You are registered! Check your email for the confirmation email with your registration details.

IMPORTANT: If you DO NOT receive an email confirmation from Karelo.com or receive a confirmation number, then you are NOT REGISTERED for the competition. Please call the BC/YT Section Office if this occurs.
