LATE ENTRIES WILL BE CHARGED DOUBLE THE ENTRY FEE. All payments must be made online at the time of registration.

<u>Online Registration</u> must be completed by 11:45 p.m. Wednesday, April 10th, 2013. Instructions for entering online can be found on page 6 of this announcement.

For all categories age shall be the age of the skater before July 1, 2012 and tests passed shall be as of April 10th, 2013 (closing date of entries).

<u>Please note that age categories may be combined if there are insufficient entries in an individual category.</u>

Regarding program requirements, the <u>2013-2014 Skate Canada Program Requirements</u> posted on the <u>Technical Page</u> of the Skating in BC website will be in effect.

**PLANNED PROGRAM SHEETS** for ALL Free Skate events may be submitted online with skater entry information or sent to the BC/YT Section office via fax (604 205 6962). Deadline to submit changes to planned program sheets is May 8th, 2013. Skaters arriving to compete who have not submitted a planned program sheet will be required to complete one when they register their music.

A tentative schedule of events and groups will be posted on the <u>Victoria Day competition page</u> of the BC/YT Section website. Any last minute changes to schedules will be posted on the website and also at the arena. Please note that events may start up to one half hour earlier than scheduled.

Starting orders will be posted a minimum of 24 hours prior to the start of the competition.

### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

- 1. Skaters may enter only one event per discipline of singles, pairs, dance and interpretive. (\*Pre-Novice Pairs may enter both short and free; Solo Dance may enter Pattern and Short Dance these events are listed separately)
- 2. Should entries in a category be exceedingly large, the event will be divided into smaller groups which will determined by random draw. Each group will be considered a final and the highest total score from all competitors in the event will determine the winner. STAR groups will be divided according to age. Interpretive events will be divided by free skate test level first and then if further grouping is required, by age.
- 3. If an event has only one competitor, the skater will be informed and have the option of skating up an event, skating for an evaluation only, or withdrawing with a refund. When skating for an evaluation, feedback may be in the form of judges' comments only, if a technical panel is not available to assess technical content. Competitors may skate up one category higher than they

are qualified.

4. MARKING: The CPC Scoring system will be used for all events with the exception of STAR 1, 2, 3A & 3B. These categories are assessed. Skaters in STAR 1, 2 & 3A will receive a ribbon and a report card corresponding to their achievement. STAR 3B skaters will be ranked and skaters placing 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> will receive medals. All skaters in STAR 3B will receive a report card showing individual element assessments.

### 5. REGISTRATION:

Skaters must register at least one hour before their event is scheduled to start.

### 6. WARM UP TIMES:

STAR 2	3 minutes
STAR 3 to Senior Bronze	4 minutes
Junior Silver to Gold Free Skate	5 minutes
Pre-Juvenile	5 minutes
Juvenile to Senior Competitive	6 minutes
Interpretive	4 minutes

Dance events will be conducted in accordance with Skate Canada regulations.

### 7. MUSIC REQUIREMENTS:

- Only CD's will be accepted. Only one program shall be recorded on each CD.
- The start of the music shall be recorded on the CD with less than two seconds of lead in.
- Competitor's name followed by music time (not skating time) shall be clearly printed on one side of the CD.
- Each CD shall be enclosed in its plastic container, also marked with the skater's name, home club, event and total music time.
- Competitors must hand in their music at the registration desk at least one hour prior to the start of their event. The Organizing Committee will accept no responsibility against damage but will take every precaution to safeguard each CD.
- A backup CD is a requirement of each competitor and should be at rinkside during the skater's performance.
- STAR 2 and STAR 3 skaters using Section music selections must provide the music on their own CD to be handed in at Registration.
- 8. COACHES: It is mandatory for all participating coaches to register at competitions and show their accreditation at all times during the competition in order to be at ice level during the events. Temporary accreditation will be issued for \$25.00 by showing current Skate Canada membership and First Aid information.
- 9. ADMISSION will be free to all.
- 10. AWARDS: A notice will be posted in the arena with information regarding the time and location of medal presentations.

<sup>\*</sup> At the discretion of the Referee, the warm up periods may be reduced to a minimum of 3 minutes. All warm-up periods for one event must be equal.

- 11. Persons wishing to take photographs of on ice performances are reminded that use of flash cameras is forbidden. The use of video cameras must be restricted to areas that do not hamper the skaters or officials. **PLEASE NOTE:** you may only take pictures or videos of your own skater.
- 12. <u>Protest Policy:</u> Skate Canada Protest Policy for competitions using CPC will be followed. RULE 7301 (6) (4). In addition, if there is an event using manual calculation where the results are not posted within one hour of the completion of the last event of the day, the protest must be made to the Event Referee within the first hour of the following day's competition. If the Event Referee is unavailable, the protest may be made to the Technical Representative or Chief Referee.
- 13. TESTS: STARSkate Free Skate Part Two tests, Senior Bronze to Gold, and Competitive tests in all categories will be offered. All levels of Interpretive Tests will also be offered. Skaters must be registered to compete in the same event they are testing in. Test Applications should be completed online by going to the <a href="Coast Registry">Coast Registry</a> website. Deadline for applications is May 3rd, 2013. Please contact Heather Tkacz if you have any questions.

## **BC/YT SECTION Online Registration Instructions**

Skate Canada-BC/YT Section has an online registration system with the company Karelo.com. All registrations must be completed using this online system. <u>Click here</u> to register.

The registration system will generate an automatic email to the skater's coach. Coaches are encouraged to check the confirmation email to ensure their skater(s) is registered in the correct event.

### Using Karelo for the first time:

The first time you use Karelo.com to register for an event, you will be asked to choose a <u>log in name & a password</u>, and to enter your contact information. When entering contact information, please use the skater's name and not the parent's name. Skate Canada Number must be entered as per your Skate Canada Card (i.e. 10 digits including all zeros). This is a very short and simple step that will enable you to avoid the hassle of re-entering your information for each event registration! Your contact information is never shared with third parties. Please review Karelo's <u>'Privacy Policy'</u> for more details.

### **Entering your registration**

<u>If you have never used Karelo.com before</u>, go to <u>I am new to Karelo.com</u> and select a login name and a password; enter your contact information. Then follow these steps:

- 1. Log in. Select the event that you want to register for from the Event List
- 2. Enter your registration information.
- 3. Enter your credit card information (Visa or MasterCard). This is a secure transaction. Your credit card is charged immediately.
- 4. You are registered! Check your email for the confirmation email with your registration details.

IMPORTANT: If you and your coach DO NOT receive an email confirmation from Karelo.com or receive a confirmation number, then you are NOT REGISTERED for the competition. Please call the BC/YT Section Office if this occurs.
