2014 BC/YK SUPER SERIES STARSKATE FINAL

Hosted by the BC /YK SECTION at Capital News Centre March 7-9, 2014

This competition is the final STARSkate event of 2013-2014 and will crown the Super Series Champions in Pre-Juvenile and STAR 5 – Gold Free Skate. Entry is open to all skaters in STARSkate Free Skate and Interpretive categories, Pre-Juvenile and Juvenile Singles. Any skaters who competed in Pre-Novice and higher at the 2014 BC/YK Skate Canada Sectionals in November 2013 are not eligible for entry in STARSkate categories in this competition. Juvenile competitors will not receive Super Series points. Adult and Special Olympics events will also be offered.

There will also be a Region Team Competition with the Super Series Region Trophy being awarded at the conclusion of the competition. Each Region will pre-select 10 skaters whose individual events placement will be valued with a score. The scores will be added up for a Region total score which will determine the final rankings. A process has been developed in order to equalize the categories so that an event with few skaters compares equally to an event with many skaters.

LATE ENTRIES WILL BE CHARGED DOUBLE THE ENTRY FEE. All payments must be made online at the time of registration.

Online Registration must be completed by 11:45 p.m. Wednesday, January 22, 2014. Instructions for

entering online can be found on page 7 of this announcement.

For all categories age shall be the age of the skater before July 1, 2013 and tests passed shall be as of January 22, 2014 (closing date of entries). <u>Please note that age categories may be combined if there are insufficient entries in an individual category.</u>

PLANNED PROGRAM SHEETS for ALL Free Skate events must be completed online at <u>Coast Registry</u> no later than February 26, 2014. If your planned program does not need updating, you must still log in and select the STARSkate Final Competition so your planned program info is provided to the Technical Officials.

A tentative schedule of events and groups will be posted on the <u>2014 Super Series STARSkate Final</u> <u>Competition</u> page of the BC/YK Section website. Any last minute changes to schedules will be posted on the website and also at the arena. Please note that events may start up to one half hour earlier than scheduled.

Starting orders will be posted a minimum of 24 hours prior to the start of the competition.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Should entries in a category be exceedingly large, the event will be divided into smaller groups which will determined by random draw. Each group will be considered a final and the highest total score from all competitors in the event will determine the winner. STAR 2 & 3 groups will be divided according to age.
- 2. If an event has only one competitor, the skater will be informed and have the option of skating up an event, skating for an evaluation only, or withdrawing with a refund. Competitors may skate up one category higher than they are qualified.
- 3. MARKING: STAR 2, 3 & 4 categories are assessed. Skaters in STAR 1, 2 & 3 will receive a ribbon and a report card corresponding to their achievement. STAR 4 skaters will be ranked and skaters placing 1st, 2nd and 3rd will receive medals. All skaters in STAR 4 will receive a report card showing individual element assessments. Special O categories will be judged using 6.0 marking system. All other categories will be marked using the CPC Scoring system.
- 4. REGISTRATION: Skaters must register at least one hour before their event is scheduled to start.

5. WARM UP TIMES:

STAR 2	3 minutes

Interpretive	3 minutes

* At the discretion of the Referee, the warm up periods may be reduced to a minimum of 3 minutes.

All warm-up periods for one event must be equal.

- 6. MUSIC REQUIREMENTS:
 - All skaters in must submit an individual CD when they register
 - A backup CD is a requirement of each competitor and should be at rinkside during the skater's performance.
 - Only CD's will be accepted. Only one program shall be recorded on each CD.
 - The start of the music shall be recorded on the CD with less than two seconds of lead in.
 - Competitor's name followed by music time (not skating time) shall be clearly printed on one side of the CD.
 - Each CD shall be enclosed in its plastic container, also marked with the skater's name, home club, event and total music time.
 - Competitors must hand in their music at the registration desk at least one hour prior to the start of their event. The Organizing Committee will accept no responsibility against damage but will take every precaution to safeguard each CD.
- 7. ICE SURFACE: 80' x 200'
- 8. COACHES: It is mandatory for all participating coaches to register at competitions and show their accreditation at all times during the competition in order to be at ice level during the events. Temporary accreditation will be issued for \$25.00 by showing current Skate Canada membership and First Aid information.
- 9. ADMISSION will be \$5 per day or \$10 all event.
- 10. AWARDS: A notice will be posted in the arena and on the website with information regarding the time and location of medal presentations.
- Protest Policy: Skate Canada Protest Policy for competitions using CPC will be followed. RULE 7301 (6) (4). In addition, if there is an event using manual calculation where the results are not posted within one hour of the completion of the last event of the day, the protest must be made to the Event Referee within the first hour of the following day's competition. If the Event Referee is unavailable, the protest may be made to the Technical Representative

BC/YK SECTION Online Registration & Planned Program Instructions

Skate Canada-BC/YK Section has an online registration system with the company Karelo.com. All registrations must be completed using this online system. <u>Click here</u> to register. The registration system will generate an automatic email to the skater's coach. Coaches are encouraged to check the confirmation email to ensure their skater(s) is registered in the correct event.

Using Karelo for the first time

The first time you use Karelo.com to register for an event, you will be asked to choose a log in name & a password, and to enter your contact information. When entering contact information, please use the skater's name and not the parent's name. Skate Canada Number must be entered as per your Skate Canada Card (i.e. 10 digits including all zeros). This is a very short and simple step that will enable you to avoid the hassle of re-entering your information for each event registration! Your contact information is never shared with third parties. Please review Karelo's <u>'Privacy Policy'</u> for more details.

Entering your registration

<u>If you have never used Karelo.com before</u>, go to '<u>I am new to Karelo.com</u>' and select a login name and a password; enter your contact information. Then follow these steps:

- 1. Log in. Select the event that you want to register for from the Event List
- 2. Enter your registration information. Please remember that if you are registering in STAR 2 you also need to choose a music selection from the drop down menu.
- 3. Enter your credit card information (Visa or MasterCard). This is a secure transaction. Your credit card is charged immediately.
- 4. You are registered! Check your email for the confirmation email with your registration details.

Online Planned Program Instructions

- 1. go to http://www.coastregistry.com/CRCompetition.aspx?HostID=2&op=PlannedProgram
- 2. click on Submit your Planned Program
- 3. click Login or Create an Account box
- 4. click on Register now
- 5. create a user name and complete the registration information
- 6. click on Identify the Skater box

7. Enter information as requested on screen. Please make sure you are using standard name rules (capitalize first letter of each name only! Please do not use CAP Lock). Click OK - The base skater profile is setup!

8. Click on Submit Planned Program box, using the drop down box to choose the event that the skater has been entered in. If the skater is entered in an event that only has one portion only a Free Program entry box will be available; if the skater is entered in an event that has both a short and a free skate program both boxes will be available.

9. Using the drop down options choose the elements that the skater is planning to execute. Do not click okay until both programs have been entered if your skater has both a short and a free skate program (but don't worry... if you did you were brought back to the original screen, just start the process again choosing your skater from the pop menu and choose Edit to bring the entry screen back up).

10. Once everything is entered click OK - You're done!
