1. The Event is being held under the current rules of the Association Official Rulebook (revised 2000) and any amendments thereto which became effective after that date. The nature of the Event is defined in the Skate Canada Technical Handbook, 5000 Competitive Program. The Association reserves the right to alter the overall procedures to be followed during any part of the Event, if such alteration is considered to be in the best interest of the skaters or the Association. The Technical Representative, Chief Referee, or Senior Referee present will be the agent of the Association in such an instance.

All events will be judged using the CPC marking system dependent on official availability. If the required officials are unavailable, the 6.0 OBO closed marking system will be used.				

- 3. **PRACTICE ICE**: Practice ice may be available based on schedule and availability. Practice ice details will be distributed if practice ice is offered. NO music will be played during practice sessions.
- 4. <u>SCHEDULE OF PRACTICE TIMES AND EVENT SCHEDULE:</u> A schedule will be posted on the Section website (<u>www.skateabnwtnun.com</u>).
- 5. **ENTRIES**: Entrants in Events shall be:
 - a) Eligible persons as defined in Skate Canada Rule Book Section 2100
 - b) Be Associate members in good standing of the Association.

Restriction of Entries – IF NECESSARY ENTRIES MUST BE LIMITED TO ADHERE TO THE SECTION GUIDELINES FOR HOURS OF COMPETITION – COMPETITION MAY NOT BEGIN BEFORE 12 PM ON FRIDAY AND MAY NOT RUN MORE THAN 12 HOURS ON SATURDAY. COMPETITION MUST BE COMPLETED BY 5 PM ON SUNDAY

Skaters entering multiple events do so with the understanding that there may be conflicts that <u>cannot</u> be resolved.

- 6. <u>CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES</u>: All entries must be received no later than January 3, 2014. In the event of a postal disruption it is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure that their entry is in to the Host Committee Registration person by the closing date, at their own expense. <u>ALL QUALIFYING TESTS MUST BE PASSED BY December 16, 2013.</u>
- 7. **LATE ENTRIES**: Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Technical Representative at **twice the entry fee until January 10, 2014**. No late entries will be accepted after this date.
- 8. **<u>REFUND OF ENTRY FEES:</u>** Entry fees shall be refunded only if the event is not held or if the entry is withdrawn before the date of close of entries (Skate Canada Rule 7000 1.5 (2)). There will be no refunds given for medical pulls after the closing date of entries, no exceptions.

9. <u>MUSIC REGISTRATION:</u> (Rule 5705) Each skater or pair will provide: 2 CDs (1 marked "Master") COPIES MUST BE TURNED IN AT REGISTRATION Information regarding the requirements and standards for music are listed in the 2013 Alberta-NWT/Nunavut Section Technical Package (General) as posted on the Section's website: <u>www.skateabnwtnun.com</u> Competitors are responsible for the recovery of their own music at the completion of the Event.

10. **ACCIDENTS**: The Association and Committee of the Host Club undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by the skater. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries in these Championships, all competitors and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, or caused by, or connected with the conduct and management of the competitions. An agreement must also be deemed to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, the Association, the Host Club, and their officers. Entries shall be accepted only in accordance with these conditions.

- 11. <u>**REGISTRATION**</u>: Skaters must register at least one hour prior to the start of their scheduled Category or practice. Music must be turned in at the time of first registration (2 copies of music must be registered). Skaters must report to the Ice Captain one hour prior to their scheduled Category. Please refer to the Alberta-NWT/Nunavut Section Competition Package (General) for further details regarding music requirements.
- 12. **FLIGHT SYSTEM:** If the number of competitors in a Category warrants it, a flight system will be used. Please refer to the 2013 Alberta-NWT/Nunavut Section Technical Package as posted on the Section's website: <u>www.skateabnwtnun.com</u> for details. Events may be split into age categories as per the technical package if numbers warrant.
- 13. **EVENT SPECIFICATIONS:** In normal circumstances, each category offered at the competition will be held for men and women separately. It is permissible for events that do not progress skaters on to a subsequent level of Interclub competition to combine events as follows:
 - (a) Combine two or more categories in the same event when each category has fewer than three entries;
 - (b) Combine two or more categories in the same event when one category has insufficient entries to hold the event;

(c) Combine men and women in events when insufficient entries are registered in one to hold the event. The decision to combine events is at the discretion of the Technical Representative and the Host Committee. In any of the above cases, categories may be combined – only with full prior knowledge and agreement of all competitors affected. If a category is not held, due to a lack of competitors, the Host Committee will inform competitors and return entry fees.

- 15. **CANCELLATION OF EVENTS:** The host club reserves the right to cancel events.
- 16. **EVENT REGISTRATION & ELIGIBILITY:** Refer to the 2013 Alberta-NWT/Nunavut Section Technical Package as posted on the Section's website: <u>www.skateabnwtnun.com</u> for details regarding skating up, technical requirements & entry/qualification restrictions.
- 17. **COACH ACCREDITATION**: All coaches must be minimally certified NCCP Primary STARSkate Certified and carry their Photo ID card indicating current membership within the Association and a valid First Aid certificate. Coaches may expect to register at the registration desk.
- WARM UP TIMES: Skate Canada has standardized warm up times for all events. Refer to the 2013 Alberta-NWT/Nunavut Section Technical Package as posted on the Section's website: <u>www.skateabnwtnun.com</u> for all warm up times.
- 19. **SKATING UP:** Skating up one level is allowed. However, competitors must register in **ONLY ONE** level of the same Category (ie, one freeskate, one elements, etc). When skating up program must meet the criteria for the higher level.
- 20. <u>AWARDS:</u> It is the responsibility of any skater receiving a medal to wear their skates and skating attire for the medal presentation.
- 21. **<u>PICTURES & VIDEOS</u>**: Persons wishing to take photographs of on ice performances are reminded that use of flash cameras is forbidden. The use of video cameras must be restricted to areas that do not hamper the skaters or officials. **PLEASE NOTE:** you may only take pictures or videos of your own skater.
- 22. PROTEST POLICY: Skate Canada Protest Policy for competitions using CPC will be followed. RULE 7301 (6) (4). In addition, if there is an event using manual calculation where the results are not posted within one hour of the completion of the last event of the day, the protest must be made to the Event Referee within the first hour of the following day's competition. If the Event Referee is unavailable, the protest may be made to the Technical Representative or Chief Referee.

ADDITIONAL TECHNICAL INFORMATION - TEAM EVENTS

This is intended as a fun event. Teams will consist of 3 or 4 skaters from the same club. Teams may be mixed or similar. Coaches must be at ice surface with their skaters. Elements will be performed in isolation. **All teams will complete the first element before performing the next element**. Each team may decide in advance which skater will perform each element.

Team Events will be judged using the CPC marking system. All elements will be assigned levels as required. Elements will be awarded a GOE. There will also be two Program Component marks awarded, one for Performance/Execution and one for Interpretation. Teams are expected to have a team bow at the end which the Interpretation score will be based on. The Performance/Execution score will be based on the elements performed.

Introductory Team Event: No test requirements. Aimed for skaters competing in the Intro Open Freeskate Category.

- 1. Loop Jump
- 2. Backward Upright Spin; Freeleg /Foot Position Optional
- 3. Salchow/Toe Loop Combination jump
- 4. Forward Outside Spiral: Unassisted position; held for a minimum 3 seconds

Bronze Team Event: Must not have passed the complete Junior Bronze Free Skating Test or higher.

- 1. Flip Jump
- 2. Sit Spin; Basic position
- 3. Loop/ Loop Combination Jump.
- 4. Forward Outside Spiral; Unassisted position; held for a minimum 3 seconds

<u>Silver Team Event</u>: Must not have passed the complete Senior Bronze Free Skating Test or higher.

- 1. Axel
- 2. Camel/Sit Spin; Minimum 2 rotations in basic positions; Additional variations in each position to be permitted
- 3. Lutz/Loop Combination Jump.
- 4. Forward Spiral Sequence; one on each foot; edge optional; Variations of position **permitted**; held for a minimum of 3 seconds each

<u>Gold Team Event:</u> Must not have passed the complete Junior Silver Free Skating Test or higher.

- 1. Double Salchow Jump.
- 2. Flying Camel Minimum 3 rotations in basic position (Additional variation permitted).
- 3. Jump Combination consisting of 1 single and 1 double jump.
- 4. Spiral Sequence

Masters Team Event: Must not have passed the complete Senior Silver Free Skating Test or higher.

- 1. Double Toe Jump.
- 2. Combination spin; Minimum 2 positions; 1 change of foot.
- 3. Jump Combination; consisting of 1 single and 1 double jump (double **must** be second jump).
- 4. Spiral sequence

<u>Competitive Team Event</u>: May have passed the complete Senior Silver Free Skating Test or higher or any Competitive Test Pre-Novice or higher.

- 1. Double Flip Jump.
- 2. Spin Combination; with at least 3 positions and 1 change of foot.
- 3. Jump combination; consisting of at least 2 double jumps.
- 4. Spiral Sequence

REGISTRATION CHANGES: There will be absolutely no changes accepted after January **17**, **2014** unless due to an error made by the technical representative. This includes being registered in the wrong event. Please confirm which event to register in with your coach before submitting your registration.
